Open Position: Staff Psychologist

Keystone Mental Health Services invites applications for a full-time licensed Staff Psychologist. The Staff Psychologist is responsible for providing comprehensive psychological evaluations for children, adolescents and adults; mental health screenings; and psychotherapy for children, families, and adults. This role includes opportunities to serve on agency committees and to offer community education and consultation. Direct client service is expected at 20 hours per week. Timeliness in completing assessment reports and all clinical documentation is of critical importance.

The Staff Psychologist is expected to stay abreast of clinical assessment, evaluation, and intervention methods shown to be empirically valid and reliable, and with demonstrated efficacy. S/he must be equipped to assess and treat a broad range of mental, emotional, and behavioral symptoms. Cultural competence within the clinical framework is essential. S/he must have an understanding of mental well-being within the context of larger systems (family, cultural, and community systems).

This position requires the ability to maintain paperwork necessary to bill third-party payers, contractors, grantors, and community funders of mental health services. Participation in the implementation of protocols and outcome measures necessary to ensure efficacy of clinical interventions is expected.

Keystone is a small mental health practice that provides a positive work environment conducive to highest quality of care, as well as professional growth and development. Practitioners are supported by Case Consultation Team, individual supervision, funding for continued education, and multi-disciplinary collaboration. Our agency mission focuses on early intervention, and a specialty of Keystone is serving the very young child. The Staff Psychologist reports directly to the Director of Clinical Programs.

Qualifications:

- A doctorate in Clinical Psychology, with formal education and training in the administration, scoring, and interpretation of a wide-range of psychological tests/measures, including projective measures.
- Proficient diagnostic abilities.
- Conscientious and skilled in clinical report writing and documentation.
- A thorough understanding of state, federal, and professional standards for legal and ethical practice.
- At least 1 year demonstrated expertise in psychological testing/evaluation, diagnosis, and individual and family psychotherapy. This experience should include services to young children.
- Ability to work as an independent practitioner using sound clinical judgment, and as a member of a multidisciplinary team.
- Licensed to practice psychology in the state of Missouri.
